

#### "Pope Names Prelates of Honor

NORWICH-Pope John Paul II named Henry N. Archambault as Prelate of Honor with the title of "Reverend Monsignor"

It signifies the high esteem in which the priest is held by his bishop and his pope. Monsignor Archambault is officialis of the Diocesan Tribunal and pastor of Sacred Heart Church in Taftville.

His brother, the Rev. Richard L. Archambault is chaplain of the Daughters of the Holy Spirit Provincialate and diocesan director of Project Northeast, both in Putnam. They are the sons of late Joseph Alexis and Bernadette Coderre.

Monsignor Archambault was graduated from St. Thomas Minor Seminary in Bloomfield. He completed philosophy and theology studies at Seminary Saint-Sulpice in Issy, France. He was ordained to the priest-hood July 11, 1959, in St. Joseph Church in North Grosvenor Dale.


He served as assistant pastor of St. Mary's Church in Willimantic and temporary administrator of Sacred Heart Church in Wauregan. He also served as district director of Confraternity of Christian Doctrine and Catholic Youth Organization. He was appointed a notary of the Norwich Diocesan tribunal in 1962.

Monsignor Archambault completed studies in 1966 at Lateran University in Rome where he received a doctoral degree in Canon Law. He was appointed secretary of the Norwich Diocesan tribunal in 1966 and in 1971 he was appointed vice-officialis of the Norwich Diocesan Tribunal. While serving as vice-officialis, he was appointed to a two-year term as conciliator on the Norwich Diocesan Board of Conciliation and Arbitration. He was appointed to the Board of Conciliation in 1974.

Monsignor Archambault was appointed pastor of Sacred Heart in Wauregan, September 22, 1976. He also served as Vicar for Priest for Windham Country and dean of the Putnam Deanery.

He became pastor of Sacred Heart Church in Taftville and officialis of the Norwich Diocesan tribunal in 1981. He was appointed in 1982 to the Board of Conciliation and Arbitration for Priests. He also is a member of the College of Consultors and of the Presbyteral Council for the diocese.

#### Rev. Richard L. Archambault

Alphonse (1860-1936)

Parish priest of Saint-Alexandre (Montérégie, Québec) (1904-1936).

"Father Joseph Alphonse Archambault was born in Marieville (Montérégie, Québec) on September 19, 1860. He was the son of Alexis Amable Archambault, blacksmith, and of Mathilde Robert said Lafontaine. Joseph Alphonse Archambault studied in Marieville where he was ordained by Mgr Moreau, on June 29, 1885.



"He was, according to everyone who ever met him, the soul of meekness. Always eager to help and to please, at all costs; and he was always kind in words for everybody. When a family was bereaved, the good father Archambault went to see them right away and never left without comforted them. His words were heartening; they offered consolation even in the worst of ordeals.

"Father Archambault was an excellent parish priest, in that he did everything to safeguard the interests of his parish.

"With the help of Dr. L.-O. Boivin, he organized a very good choir that is still the pride and joy of the town of Saint-Alexandre. With the income from the masses where they sang for other parishes, he organized every year a banquet and a picnic that was attended by a large audience.

"Moreover, father Archambault had theatre companies come from Montréal to present plays from their repertoire. He even directed plays with local actors. As he used to say, it was a good way to line the cashbox of the parish and at the same time, prevent the parish youth to be corrupted by going to the movies in the big town of Saint-Jean-d'Iberville (Montérégie, Québec).

"Father Archambault had the cemetery repaired and the church embellished.


#### Joseph Noël Archambault

Joseph Noël, came back from the United States and owned different stores over the years. They were all established in Montréal, in the Saint-Joseph Parish. In 1880, at a census records he lived at 632/34 Saint-Joseph Street and is said to be a grocer. In 1890, the records of another census show that he moved to 2588 Notre-Dame, in Montréal and that he was still a grocer. In 1905, his address was 2495, Notre-Dame, and then 851 Notre-Dame West, on the corner of Saint-Martin, and he lived at 85, Saint-Martin. In 1908/1909, he lived at 702, Notre-Dame West. In 1895, the store was established on the corner of Notre-Dame and Chatham. Unfortunately, the building was demolished.

"Wilfrid Archambault, the actual General Manager of sales of the *Consolidated Distilleries Ltd* was born on August 26, 1876 in Willimantic, Conn., USA. He was the son of Joseph Noël Archambault, a negotiator, formerly from Marieville (Centre-du-Québec, Québec), and his spouse, Marie Louise Larose, daughter of Hubert Larose of Verchères (Montérégie, Québec).

"He attended the school of des Frères at a very young age where he received a primary education that later on allowed him to pursuit his studies at the Petit Séminaire de Sainte-Marie-de-Monnoir in Marieville, and to complete them at 1'école du Plateau in Montréal. At the end of his education in 1890, he started in the grocery commerce by working for his father. After obtaining sufficient experience, he entered the service of wholesaler L. Chaput Fils & Cie in 1892. During the following year, he joined the Hudon, Hébert & Cie and, for forty years, he was one of the most loyal collaborators. From a simple clerk he was, he became a traveling salesman, an Assistant General Manager, an Administrator, and at last a Vice President of the most important French Canadian Commercial Corporation in the country. At the time of the amalgamation of the Hudon, Hébert & Cie with Laporte & Martin Ltée, in 1932, he took the General Manager's position until June 1934. At that time he was appointed General Manager of Sales of the *Consolidated Distilleries Ltd.*, one of the subsidiaries of the *Canadian Industrial Co. Ltd.*"

Mr. Archambault did not join politics. However, he was a member of the Council for the city of Saint-Lambert (Montérégie, Québec) from 1901 to 1905.

He was member of La société Saint-Jean-Baptiste, of l'Alliance Nationale, the Montréal Board of Trade, and the Chamber of Commerce.

Mostly, the sports in the out door interested him.

On August 22, 1899, he married Reina Chagnon dit Lachance who gave him two daughters and one son; on April 26, 1909, he married Louise Leduc, the daughter of François-Xavier Leduc, and two sons and two daughters were born from this union.

#### Bennett Archambault

Bennett was the son of Joseph Albert and Mary Mae Smale and the grandson of Frédéric and Malvina Handfield.



Bennett was born in Oakland, California, where he spent the first years of his life before his family moved to Montana. He studied at the Georgia Institute of Technology, and later at the prestigious Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) to further his education.

During most of his life, he played an important role as president, vice-president or general manager in different companies and was very involved in social issues.

He started working for M. W. Kellogg Co., in New York in 1935, a company specialized in electronic and refinery equipment. He was vice-president and CEO of this company from 1946 to 1954.

He was appointed, during the Second World War, from 1942 to 1945, head of the European Branch of the American Bureau of Sci-

entific Research and Development specialized in the development and manufacturing of new weapons and ammunitions. His work in this position rewarded him with the Medal of Merit of Great-Britain for his service in the defence of Liberty.

In 1955, he became president of Stewart – Warner Co., a manufacturer of electronic products, auto parts and heating systems.

Bennett Archambault married Margaret Henrietta Morgan, who was born on June 22 1917, in Butte, Montana. Her father was the owner of a bar and a hotel. She was still very young when her father bought a farm in the South of the State of California. Her mother died when she was only 12 years old, and Margaret (Margot) was brought up by relatives.



She started working in California as an actress and model, where she had Rudy Vallee as her suitor. She moved to New York where she met Bennett. They got married on February 19, 1948. Margot was very much involved as a volunteer work for different social associations.

The couple had three children: Suzanne Morgan Archambault-Briley, Michelle Lorraine and Steven who died in the year 2000.

Bennett was a member of many organizations, social clubs and numerous technical councils. Up to his death, he was a member of the Association des Archambault d'Amérique. He died in July 1996 from complications due to pneumonia. He was 86 years old.

Margaret died from a heart attack on April 4, 2010 at the Northwestern Memorial Hospital.



Being a lover of spiders is a common fact, but to venture in the depth of the earth to discover particular species of spiders, not yet listed, as the blind spider, is quite unusual.

#### Chasing Blind Spiders Frédéric Pepin

For a large number of persons, spiders are disgusting living creatures; but, for Martin Archambault, these tiny insects with 8 legs are a true passion.

In his leisure time, Martin, a physical education teacher in Montréal, explores caves as a speleologist. He never misses an opportunity to venture in caves exploration, many that had not yet been visited. Speleology has been his hobby for over 20 years.

In recent years, he is engaged in another activity: trying to find spiders in the depths of the earth.

From August 29<sup>th</sup> to September 21<sup>st</sup> 2009, Mr. Archambault took part in an expedition at Tian Xing, in China where he went underground at a depth of 400 meters. Soon, further laboratory studies will confirm if he made new discoveries.


This teacher recognized the difficulties of such an expedition: "Being in the depth of the earth was a terrifying experience. What was supposed to last 20 hours, in fact, lasted 25 hours. I reached my physical and psychological limits. It has been the most demanding descent of my life."

He used a straightforward technical: with the help of a small tube fitted with a filter, he sucks up the arachnids which sometimes can be as small as the head of a needle. Then, he let them drop into an alcohol filled flask to ensure their conservation for further analyses.

This species is named in honor of Martin Archambault, fellow caver and friend who helped collect many leptonetids in Texas and Mexico.

When a participant asked if it


